**Professor V.S. Ram IPSA National Senior Political Scientist Award
2012**

The Indian Political Science Association finds immense pleasure in announcing its first Professor V.S. Ram IPSA National Senior Political Scientist Award to *Professor Noorjahan Bawa*.

Professor V.S. Ram was the main inspiration behind the establishment of the first Department of Political Science in the University of Lucknow in the year 1922. He was among the founders of Indian Political Science Association in 1937. He also served the Association as President in 1942 and Editor in 1946 and 1948-49. During his celebrated career as distinguished political scientist and an immensely appreciated educationist, Professor Ram was instrumental in popularizing the study of Political Science in different universities of India. His contribution to the study of the role and governance of modern government, the state's relationship with labour, municipal government in India and the study of administrative apparatus have great academic importance even today. Indian Political Science Association salutes his academic leadership. We find it elating to remember the path-breaking intellectual commitment of Professor V.S. Ram on this occasion.

Professor Noorjahan Bawa is a distinguished political scientist with a chequered academic career of more than forty five years. Specializing in Public Policy and Development Administration in the Third World, Professor Bawa received her Masters in Political Science from Presidency College, University of Madras in 1959. She had been teaching Political Science in various institutions since December 1959. Upto 2001, she was the Vice-President of New Public Administration Society of India. She was awarded as Distinguished Member Award for outstanding service to the discipline of Public Administration by the Indian Institute of Public Administration in 2007. She has published ten books including Human Rights and Criminal Justice Administration, NGOs in Development, Public Policy and Administration besides publishing a large number of articles and research papers in various renowned journals and edited volumes. Her contribution to the study and development of Political Science and Public Administration through teaching, research, curriculum development, seminars and public administration is greatly commendable and phenomenal.

He worked as Proctor, Chief Warden, OSD, Dean, Member EC, Chief Employment Bureau, etc. in university administration. Having a vast experience of organizing training programmes and academic events, Professor Barthwal has also served as a trainer for government, public sector, banking sector and other professional organizations. Supervising more than seventy candidates for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Political Science, Public Administration and Management, he has done independent research and a good number of projects on Weaker Sections and Women Issues. He has widely travelled in India and abroad including countries like United Kingdom, United States, Japan, Singapore, Norway, Thailand, Canada, Argentina, UAE, Hong Kong and former USSR. He has published more than three dozen research papers in professional journals besides publishing a good number of books on Public Administration, Local Self Government, Social Justice, Management, National Integration, Good Governance, Right to Information and Modern Political Analysis. For his contribution to the academics, he has been awarded Dr. Ganesh Shankar Vidyarthi Award, Best Research Paper Award, Parvat Gaurav Samman, Uttarakhand Ratan and Intellectual Peace Award besides others. Shri Nihal Singh Yadav IPSA National Award for Contribution to the Study of Ancient Indian Politics

The first ever Sri Nihal Singh yadav IPSA National Award for Contribution to the Study of Ancient Indian Politics is given to Professor KK Mishra.

Shri Nihal Singh Yadav was a philanthropic educationist of rural Delhi, a popular teacher of English, deeply spiritual scholar of History, Urdu, Arabic and Persian and a trusted Ayurvedic practitioner. Born to a farmer in south Haryana, he topped his province in board examination with distinction in all subjects, but the financial constraints and non-availability of educational institutions in the area forced him to join as a clerk in the Army. He had a British General as his boss who hated his Indian Clerk when he corrected his drafts grammatically and linguistically. He travelled to Iran, Iraq, Egypt, Afghanistan, Japan etc with the army during the Second World War, but left it at the first opportunity, took a degree in Ayurved and started a flourishing practice. Besides, he continued further studies and acquired degrees in Education and History and soon was invited to head a DAV School amidst Samaipur Badli villages in Rural Delhi with twenty students and two make shift rooms which he expanded to a senior secondary school with around two thousand students of almost twenty neighbouring villages and produced board toppers A kind and compassionate soul, firm believer in equity and social dignity for all, he encouraged and supported poor students for higher studies and provided free English coaching to girl students which he continued till his last breath. While studying Ayurveda, he was fascinated by Sanskrit which continued lifelong and made him advise his own children and a number of his students study Sanskrit and appreciate India and its civilization roots.

Professor Kaushal Kishore Mishra is an outstanding scholar of the ancient Indian politics and institutions. He has done extremely commendable research in the field of ancient and modern Indian political thought, Indian government and politics and journalism. He has published more than twenty books and seventy five research papers. Professor Mishra has supervised thirty scholars for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. He served as a member of Madhyamik Shiksha Chayan Board of Uttar Pradesh for three years. His contribution to the study of ancient Indian politics is seminal, committed and extraordinary. He has given new meanings to the ancient Indian texts with contemporary reference. His readings on Manu Smriti, Panchtantra, Mahabharata, Kamandak and Kautilya's Arthashastra have demonstrated his immense intellectual understanding and impartial analytical strength. His sincerity for the study and research in various aspects of ancient Indian polity has encouraged many other scholars of the discipline to try their hands in this field. Dr. Mishra is an unrelenting crusader of Ancient Indian Political Thought.
